The Mostviertel is Lower Austria's most alluring region, brimming with tempting delights. A haven of culinary indulgence nestled between the Danube and the Ötztal mountains. The charming contrast between the mild, fertile lands of the north and the rugged alpine scenery of the south proves an irresistible draw to embark on fascinating journeys of discovery, mountain adventures and enjoyable family holidays.



The mild Mostviertel

Birnenmost, wine, juice and an array of other delicacies

The gently rolling hills south of the Danube are home to Most producers and distillers, winegrowers and farmers. Flourishing under a mild climate, over 300 varieties of pear are grown along the famous Moststraße (Perry Road), which stretches for around 200 km. The people of the Mostviertel produce different types of Birnenmost (perry) from some 20 varieties of pear, mostly of single origin. Grapes – predominantly the “Grüner Veltliner” variety – thrive in the winegrowing region of Traisental. Over in the Pielachtal, otherwise known as the Pielach Valley, wild red fruit, the Dirndl, grow in abundance. Rosehips are the specialty of the Dunkelsteinerwald hill country, while the eastern part of the Mostviertel, bordering the Vienna Woods, is famous for its Elsbeeren (chequer trees). Situated in the heart of the region is the Lower Austrian capital of St. Pölten.

The wild Mostviertel

Majestic mountains and fiery forges

Strange rock formations, fathomless gorges, bubbling brooks and three nature parks are the distinctive features of this wild, alpine world. The Mostviertel Alps, famed for their striking peaks towering nearly 2,000 metres into the sky the Ötztal, the Hochkar, the Dürrenstein, the Gipfel and the Göller are beloved among hikers and nature lovers in the summer. Visitors to the ÖTSCHER-REICH can expect some unique excursions, guided nature tours, as well as a range of incomparable ÖTSCHER-REICH products. This was once the home of the “Black Smiths”, as the mighty “hammern” were once called: the blacksmiths, the charcoal burners, and the woodcutters. Today, museums and themed routes along the Eisenstraße relate colourful tales about these long-gone times.

TIP: A winter holiday can still be affordable. Mostviertel ski regions both big and small score highly for their attractive offers for day trips and short winter breaks.

Picture-perfect landscapes straight out of a fairy book, with “wild delicacies” from the red Dirndl fruit (Cornelian cherry) to wild herbs.

Mostviertel pilgrimage trails

Pilgrimages have enjoyed a long tradition in the Mostviertel region, and have experienced rather a renaissance over the last few years. The final destination of many pilgrimage routes is the town of Mariazell, a Marian pilgrimage site.


Pilgrimage routes
Perhaps the oldest pilgrimage route in Austria is the Via Sacra. A more athletic alternative is the Wiener Wallfahrweg (Viennese Pilgrimage Route). Both are around 220 km long. Via Sacra begins in the town of Brunn am Gebirge, while the Wiener Wallfahrweg starts in Perchtoldsdorf or Wien-Rudau. Each trail passes through the Vienna Woods, the Vienna Alps and the Mostviertel region until reaching Mariazell. Certified Via Sacra hosts, dedicating themselves especially to the needs of their pilgrim guests, are situated along both trails. www.viasacra.at

Further pilgrimage routes include the Pielachtaler Pilgerweg (Manker Pilgrimage Route), the Oberösterreichische Mariazellerweg (Upper Austrian Mariazell Route), the Sonntagbergweg (Sonntagberg Route) and a section of the Jakobsweg (Way of St. James).

Pear trees & quadrangle farms

The part of the Mostviertel where people have devoted themselves entirely to producing Birnenmost, or fermented pear juice, is nothing short of a vast garden. Benefiting from the mild climate south of the Danube, these fine fruits ripen to perfection on some hundreds of thousands of gnarled old trees. The **200 km Moststraße** weaves its way through a hilly landscape, past rows of venerable pear trees and stately Vierkanthöfe, farmsteads around an enclosed courtyard. Snug inns, rustic Mostscheurer taverns and well-maintained Perry Road hostleries make for tempting places to linger a while. Farmers are only too pleased to sell their wares farm-fresh. Employing a great deal of commitment and a wealth of innovative ideas, the people of the Mostviertel have been able to transform the fruits of Europe's largest contiguous pear tree area into liquid heaven: juices, liqueurs, fine brandies, sparkling wine, pear **fizzante**, and of course perry.

Single-origen perries are a rarity in Europe. Anyone sampling these ciders for the first time will be astonished by their diversity of flavour and aroma - from mild 'starter' perries (made with Speckbirne or Steirerbirne pears) to crisp ciders that pack a punch (Grüne Pflüchbirne, Dorschbirne). Perry has a very low alcohol content (4 to 8 per cent by volume).

Mostviertel locals know how to celebrate too: **Mostfrühling (Spring Perry Festival)** is the time when the pear trees burst into flower, transforming the land into a sea of brilliant white. Celebrations also take place at harvest time in autumn, when the young perry begins filling in the barrels. In early winter, the young perry is first served for tasting. www.moststrasse.at

TIP: For true expert insight into proper Mostviertel perry culture, you'll need a **Mostbaron** ('cider baron'). Together, they develop the finest perries and brandies, invite you to specialist tastings and come up with informative and entertaining programmes for all ages. www.mostbaron.at

Stift Seitenstetten (abbey)

For hundreds of years, Seitenstetten Abbey has shaped the people, nature and culture around it. Also known as the 'Kloster der Götter' (God's Courtyard), the Abbey certainly makes an impact on visitors with its baroque treasures, unique gallery and historical gardens boasting 130 varieties of rose. Built in 1122 by Josef Munggenast, it is adorned with artworks by celebrated artists such as Paul Troger, Albrecht Dürer, Krenner Schmidt, Altonne, Maria Lassnig, Fritz Wotruba and many other influential artists of the 20th century! Ötscher-Tormäuer Nature Park

Peace in the wild

Visible for miles around is the **Ötscher mountain**, the emblem of the **Mostviertel**. It forms the centre point of one of Europe's most stunning landscapes: the Ötscher-Tormäuer Nature Park. Famous for its peaks and troughs and its extensive system of gorges. It spans an expanse of 170 km², making it the largest nature park in Lower Austria. Quietly simple, an inspiring refuge for those wishing to draw new strength from the peace and serenity of Nature. Visitors are particularly astounded by its **unspoilt scenery**. Its interplay of bizarrely shaped crags, yawning ravines, waterfalls, caverns, tranquil forests, alpine meadows, lakes and gorgeous viewpoints. The park is best explored in the company of a nature guide. www.naturpark-otscher.at/naturvermittler

The **deep incisions carved into the valley by the Erlauf river** (the Vorderer and Hinterer Tormäuer formations) are nothing short of extraordinary, especially those made by the Ötscherbach - the **Ötschergraben**, otherwise known as the Grand Canyon of Austria.

A variety of leisurely and challenging routes meander through the Nature Park. Starting points are easily accessible - you can even take the Mariazell Railway. Numerous inns and mountain chalets offer the perfect spot for stopping off for a bite to eat and a rest.

Mostviertler Bauernmuseum Amstetten (farming museum)

The largest private folk collection in Austria, located at the striking Vierkanthof (quadrangular farmstead), visits by advance booking. www.nadlingerhof.at

NO Freilichtmuseum Haag and Mostviertelmuseum "mostMUSIK" Haag

An open-air museum in the centre of Haag, featuring log cabins, a Froadkloster (granary), a private mill with water wheel, and much more. Admission is free, guided tours by advance request. In addition, the Mostviertelmuseum offers a window into farming culture and work in the past - with audio voices and fitting music. Visits by advance booking. www.stadt haag.at

Baroque bathhouse in Haag

The bathhouse belonging to Salberg Castle is a real rarity, comparable to the Badenberg (bathing lodge) in the grounds of Nymphenburg Palace in Munich, or the Mariele-Baths at Kassel Castle. www.stadt haag.at

Mostthöhenstraße

A panoramic road between St. Michael am Bruckbach and "Wieserhöhe" with wonderful views of the alpine mountain world and the gently rolling hills of the Moststraße (Perry Road). www.moststrasse.at

Take a cruise on the Danube through the romantic Strudengau, the legendary Nibelungengau, and the Wachau region from Easter to 28 October; eventful trips through the locks. www.donauschiffahrt-ardagger.at

Lower Austrian Eisenstraße (Iron Road)

Region of the five elements

The Iron Road of Lower Austria joins the gentle hills of the lowlands with the Mostviertel Alps around the Hochkar, Dürrenstein and Ötscher. **Five elements** - fire, water, wood, metal and earth - shape the history and the character of the region. Fire, water and wood were fundamental for ironworking in this craggy alpine region. Thanks to the fertile soil to be found among the undulating hills of the Mostviertel, there was food in abundance, transported to the smithies, the charcoal burners and the woodcutters via the "Proviantweg" (supply route). Today, those looking for a spot of adventure can set off on the trail of all five elements: pay a visit to the forges, watch the smiths at work, try their hand at this art themselves, or watch how timber used to be floated for transport. More than 170 excursion destinations and themed routes are waiting to be explored along the Lower Austrian Iron Road. So keep your energy levels up at the numerous Iron Road Inns and taverns serving seasonal, regional delicacies throughout the year. www.eisenstrasse.at

Traisen-Gölsental

Water, woods & wild game

Mountains with glorious views and sparkling watercourses characterise the Traisen-Gölsental, Austria's most densely wooded area. The regions of Lilienfeld-Voralpen Wild and Traisentaler Hofkas are packed with culinary delights. Two cycle paths, the **Traisentalradweg** and the **Gölsentalradweg**, as well as two of the best-known pilgrim routes in Austria, **Via Sacra** and the **Wiener Wallfahrtsweg (Vienna Pilgrimage Route)**, all make their way through the valleys here. The most popular mountains for hiking and enjoying the view are the Muckenkogel at Lilienfeld, and the Gippel and Göller at St. Aegyd/Neuwald.

Dunkelsteinerwald

Wild roses & rosehips

The Dunkelsteinerwald is situated to the south of the Danube and enchants visitors with its peaceful forests, vast meadows, wonderful views and legendary viewing spots. The **medieval fortress ruins of Agststein** lie high above the Wachau valley. The Dunkelsteinerwald is well-known for its wild roses, which bloom from the end of May through to mid July. Rose blossom and the fruits of the rose-rosehips rich in vitamin C - are turned into delicacies such as liquors, jams, chocolates and wild rose ice cream. The top addresses for accommodation, eating and shopping are the designated "Hagebutten Genusspartner". www.arge-dunkelsteinerwald.at

Elsbeere-Wienerwald

Kingdom of the Elsbeer tree

At the point where the Mostviertel begins to merge with the Vienna Woods lies the Elsbeere-Wienerwald region. **Elsbeeren are red-dish-brown fruits with a nutlike marzipan, growing on tall trees that stand freely in the fields and often reach over one hundred years of age. Elsbeere** are picked by hand here, a very time-consuming harvesting practice that is not without its hazards. Elsbeerbrand is therefore one of the most expensive distillates around. The fruits are also used to make liquors, jams and other specialties. The Elsbeere was classified as Austria's first Slow Food Presidio Product. www.elsbeere-wienerwald.info

Pielachtal

Valley of the Dirndl

The Pielachtal begins south of St. Pölten and stretches from a gentle hilly landscape right up to the rugged Mostviertel Alps around the Ötscher-Tormäuer Nature Park. The Pielachtal is one of Austria's most natural rivers. Visitors are enchanted by the **picturesque cultural landscape**, peppered with numerous trails for hikers, cyclists and pilgrims. The Pielachtal is known as the "Tal der Dirndl", or Valley of the Cornelian Cherry. The **radiant red Dirndl** - an old wild fruit - symbolises the natural riches of the valley. Dirndl and Pielachtal residents waste no time in making all sorts of specialities from this bitter-sweet fruit: juices, jams, brandies, even spicy "Pielachtaler Oliven". Dirndl are the focal point of festivals such as the **Pielachtaler Dirndlkirtag** at the end of September. For their highly sensitive approach to the natural and cultural treasures present in the region, the people of Pielachtal won the **EDEN Award** as a flagship region for sustainability in Europe. www.pielachtal.info

- 2 Viewing tower "Korkenzieher" on the Ahrenberger and Eichenberger Kellergasse ("wine cellar lanes")** 35m tall observation tower set amidst the vineyards on the "Kellergasse", or "lane of wine cellars" (staffed all year round).
